

Dear Parents/Guardians,

As part of our KIDS VOTING civic awareness activities, your student's homework assignment is to identify his/her polling place and districts for the various elections occurring on November 3. These are the same as yours and are determined by your address. If you are registered to vote in the correct precinct, your districts for US House, NC Senate, NC House, County Commissioner, and School Board should be found on your voter registration card. Your polling place is the name of the place where you go to vote (i.e. church, school, community building, etc.)

If you are registered but do not know where your polling place is located, you may visit the Elections Office website at <http://www.sboe.state.nc.us/VoterLookup.aspx> or call the Guilford County Elections Office in Greensboro (641-3836) or High Point (845-7895) before 5pm. If you are not registered to vote and are eligible to do so, you may do so through October 9 (the adult voter registration deadline for the Nov. 3 election). Registration forms are available at:

Once you register, you will be notified by mail of your precinct, polling place location, and various districts. You may also register at an early "one stop" voting site if you choose to vote early.

If you are ineligible to register, you can still get the information that your child needs by calling the Election Office in Greensboro (641-3836) or High Point (845-7895). Your child will still be able to vote on Election Day even though you are not registered and cannot vote.

Thank you for your help. **Please encourage your student to participate in the excellent hands-on educational opportunity of going to the real polls to vote on real people on Nov. 3.** At the polling place, there will be a KIDS VOTING area where students may cast their own ballots in this year's election. Elementary and Middle School students should be accompanied to the polls by an adult; high school students are welcome unaccompanied. **On Tuesday, November 3, both KIDS VOTING and adult polls will be open from 6:30am – 7:30pm., though Kids Voting polls will be "self serve" during school hours. Early voting will also be available to students at the *early voting sites*.**
